- In-person instruction for entire grade class during one-day or multiple-day sessions.
- · School will be mailed printed packets for students to use and keep during and after class.
- · Geared towards larger groups of students of all learning levels for general strategies to improve their scores.
- · Can be scheduled during the school day, after-school or weekends
