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- FTA will fund up to \$4,000 per fiscal year for voluntary off-duty education programs in support of a Soldier's professional and personal selfdevelopment goals
  - Maximum 16 semester hours per fiscal year (1 Oct-30 Sep)
  - Up to \$250 per semester hour
  - 130 semester hours towards an associates and/or baccalaureate degree
  - 39 semester hours towards a master's degree
  - 21 semester hours towards an undergrad or grad academic certificate (limited to one per career)



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- Soldier is in good standing and has a CAC card (Completion of basic training and AIT is no longer required)
- Soldier cannot be flagged
- Soldier's ArmylgnitED account cannot be on hold or have any blockers
- Requests must be submitted and approved at least 7 days <u>PRIOR</u> to course start date (may submit up to 60 days prior)
- Must maintain a 2.0 GPA for undergraduate degrees after 15 SHs of coursework; 3.0 GPA for graduate degrees after 6 SHs of coursework
- Must submit an evaluated degree plan after submission of two FTA funded courses



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# Use With Other Programs

- ■Soldiers can request FTA in conjunction with State Tuition Assistance, Pell Grant, work-study programs, college scholarships
- ■Can use FTA and the MGIB-SR together for the same course if ½ time or more enrolled
- ■Can use with other GI Bill programs (Ch 30 and 33) but cannot exceed 100% of tuition cost



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## Requirements & Restrictions

- School must have signed the DoD MOU and be listed in ArmylgnitED
- FTA pays tuition only, it does not pay fees including, lab fees, enrollment fees, parking fees, etc.
- FTA is not authorized for lower or lateral degrees
- FTA is **not** authorized for first professional degrees
- FTA will not pay for double major
- Soldiers cannot receive reimbursement from ROTC or Green-to-Gold scholarships





- Soldiers must have 60 days or more remaining to complete all courses before separating
- Traditional drilling/M-Day Officers (CW2, 2LT, and above) subject to a four-year MSO after the last day of the course
- AGR/Active Duty Officers (CW2, 2LT and above) subject to two-year
  MSO after the last day of the course





- Soldiers will be subject to recoupment if they:
  - Receive a grade of:
    - D & F for undergraduate degree
    - C, D, & F for graduate degree
  - Receive an incomplete for the course
  - Do not complete their MSO
  - Withdraw from a course without an approved military withdrawal
    Military withdrawals must be submitted within 30 days

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- 1. Contact your Education Services Specialist for counseling and information on how to submit an FTA request.
- 2. Go to <a href="https://www.armyignited.army.mil">https://www.armyignited.army.mil</a> and log in with CAC card.
- Make sure your Civilian e-mail and cell number are in your profile in AIED.
- 4. Complete the NGB Virtual Benefits training (NGB VBT) in AIED.
- 5. Create your Education Goal in AIED and add a degree plan.
- 6. Request FTA in AIED, but make sure your start and end dates are correct.
  - You can submit your TAR up to 60 days before the term, but you MUST submit it at least eight days before the first day of class.
- 7. Sign and Print DA 7792 in AIED and turn in to your school.

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
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
